Report finds 2019 performance of Dublin's Local Authorities was mixed

- Independent oversight body identified several areas of improvement and concern across Ireland's local government sector –

17 December 2020: A report by the independent watchdog of local government has revealed the performance of Dublin's four local authorities in 2019 across eleven areas. The annual report, by the National Oversight and Audit Commission (NOAC), found the Council delivered mixed results in a range of areas including housing, the environment and financial management.

The NOAC uses 39 indicators across eleven areas to measure local authority performance. The data is submitted by the local authorities and other State and regulatory bodies.
